Nairukoki is a single mother of seven children and part of a growing movement of women making a world of difference in Longido.

She is guided by a simple wisdom: "The world is changing and we must change, too."

Though uneducated herself, Nairukoki says education is the key to moving forward. This is the reason she decided to join TEMBO's Micro-Business Program two years ago. She overcame her fear of not being able to pay her loan back because she has grandchildren who need an education.

"I was not making enough money as a bead maker but now my business is good," says Nairukoki.

Being a member of TEMBO's Micro-Business Program, Nairukoki now feels empowered to help her grandchildren live a better life by helping with their secondary school education.

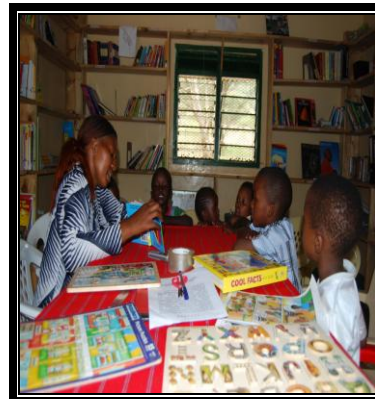
Though her financial contribution may be small, in the traditional Maasai world her actions are creating a huge shift. In the life of one girl, it is an immeasurable gift.

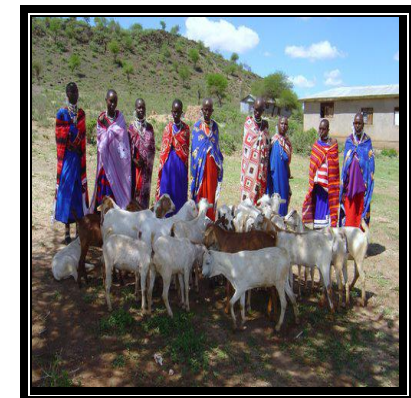
